Why is it so important?

Advances in neuroscience show the brain is not fully

"wired" at birth. The experiences and interactions children have in these early years of development directly impact how they relate to and communicate with peers, form relationships with adults, and learn.

Is this free play or is there structure?

It's essentially free play with a loose structure to encourage interaction.


I have more than 1 child. Can siblings come? Siblings up to age 5 may participate in the art/craft area.

What do caregivers do during the program? Caregivers play along with their child, talk to other caregivers, find informative reading materials and confer with experts.

Who are the experts and what will they do? Each week, a representative from a separate child and family service agency will speak with each parent, help identify issues, address specific concerns & share information.
